

THE SEVENTH TRADITION

To support Al-Anon's essential services in Australia, the following suggestions may aid any group wishing to meet all of its financial responsibilities.





Provide for the basic group expenses, such as rent, refreshments, and fresh supplies of Conference Approved Literature (CAL).



Divide remaining funds on any suitable basis to contribute to Al-Anon's whole service structure:



DISTRICT AND AREA SERVICES:

to support the Area Assembly, the Area Committee and Area Delegate undertake Public Information and Institutions work, throughout the Area, the Area Information Service Office needs to be supported in their Twelfth Step work and other services.



AUSTRALIAN GENERAL SERVICE OFFICE (AGSO):

to support its services to groups and in helping to carry the Al-Anon message throughout Australia.

WORLD SERVICE OFFICE (WSO):

which provides policy and guidance for Al-Anon worldwide.

HOW YOU AND YOUR GROUP CAN CONTRIBUTE:

(1) TRI-ANNUAL APPEAL. In response to each appeal letter, whenever possible, the group sends excess funds in the group treasury. Special fundraising functions may be held. Some groups prefer to contribute monthly or quarterly.

(2) BIRTHDAY PLAN. In gratitude for Al-Anon, members like to contribute \$1.00 per year for each year in the fellowship. You can ask that the group be credited.

(3) INDIVIDUAL CONTRIBUTIONS. Limited to \$50,000 annual contributions from individual Al-Anon or Alateen members, and may be sent directly to the AGSO.

(4) IN MEMORIAM GIFTS. Any Al-Anon or Alateen member may make contributions to the AGSO in memory of anyone now deceased.

(4) BEQUESTS. The AGSO accepts a one time legacy from any Al-Anon member in any amount. Contact AGSO for details.

(6) SPECIAL CONTRIBUTIONS. Proceeds from Al-Anon/Alateen conventions, anniversaries, fundraisers, dinners, Area get-togethers, and so on. (Contributions received from an AA Convention, offered to Al-Anon as acknowledgment of its participation at these functions, may be accepted by the AGSO.) Ref. YOUR CONTRIBUTION TO THE AGSO HELPS IT TO:

- Serve the 360+ Al-Anon and Alateen groups throughout Australia registering new groups, maintaining group records, overseeing the website, publishing 'Contacting Al-Anon in Australia', sharing solutions to problems.
- Provide assistance and starter pack to new groups.
- Plan and host the annual Australian Service Conference.
- Import Conference Approved Literature (CAL) from the World Service Office, and with WSO's permission, reprint selected CAL items in Australia.
- Carry the message through Public Information (PI) and cooperation with professionals, supporting and encouraging Area PI Coodinators.
- Publish and distribute our monthly magazine, Austra-Link, to groups and individual members, and Alateen Link-Up for Alateen groups.
- Maintain communication with Lone Members, arrange a sponsor if requested, supply free literature and regular copies of Austra-Link.
- Answer enquiries from the media, the medical profession, students and others seeking Al-Anon information.
- Encourage the formation of Al-Anon groups in treatment facilities and correctional institutions.
- Distribute information and relevant material to Area Coordinators around Australia.
